Plymouth Congregational Church

- *The Church in the Garden*
- Part of the historic fabric of the city of Miami
- Founded in 1897; Sanctuary completed in 1917; Cloister Garden completed the following year

Congregational Heritage

- Heirs to the Pilgrims and the Puritans
 - No royal charter needed to form a church, only a covenant based on Jesus' promise that...*wherever two or three are gathered in his name...he would be there*
- A new way of "being and doing" church
 - Each church is free and independent before God, and seeks to understand God's will for itself
 - Each member has a voice
 - Roots of American democracy

United Church of Christ

- Plymouth is a member of the United Church of Christ (UCC)
- The UCC was founded in 1957
- Merger of denominations: Congregational, Christian, Evangelical & Reformed...based on Jesus' words...*that they all might be one*
- Congregational type of democratic governance
- *No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here*

Worship and Church Life

- We gather each Sunday at 10 a.m., bringing our many different traditions and life stories with us, to worship the Lord in Jesus Christ (Livestreamed as well)
- We seek to lift-up the basic tenets of the Christian faith in the context of the modern world, centered on the Word of God and Our Lord Jesus Christ
- We are eager to connect with the spectrum of believers and perspectives in our midst
- Chancel Choir and extensive music program, Dr. Vindhya Khare, Director of Music



- Communion Table – the 3rd Sunday of each month – open to all who desire a relationship with Jesus Christ
- Nurturing Faith (Sunday School) – children stay in worship until after the Children's Moment, and then go to Sunday School – Andrea Burt, Director of Children's Ministries
- Joyful Noise (Children's Choir) – meets after Nurturing Faith – Marie Ferguson, Director of Joyful Noise Choir
- Youth @ Plymouth – meets weekly on Sunday afternoons – Rev. Hollie Schmidt, Associate Pastor for Church Life, Youth and Mission
- Confirmation 2024 – 8th and 9th graders – Pastor Hollie, supported by Pastor Al and Pastor Moira
- Fellowship Hour – where the service, in a sense, continues, as we get to know each other in the Cloister Garden; famous for our secret recipe coffee (ice cream in it)
- Special worship services – Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday
- Fellowship events – strong Church Life calendar; events such as potlucks, pickleball outings, BBQ's, Luau's, Dinners for 8, Fashion Show, Cinco de Mayo, Lenten Small Groups
- Mission and Outreach opportunities – through BOOM, Emergency Response Fund and This 'N That Thrift Shop

Plymouth Today

- 800 members; 200 on Sundays (post-Covid)
- 11-acre campus with 21 buildings; some staff live on campus
- Healthy growing church – over 350 new members the past 10 years
- Given Congregational roots, a “roll up the sleeves” kind of church
- Every member has a vote at our Annual Meeting each January
- Budget for the church of around \$1.7 million
- Annual needs: Christian Commitment Campaign raises \$900k+ and is the most important source for our budget
 - \$8.2 million Endowment (the “Foundation”) also supports the budget through a 4.7% spending formula (trailing 12-month average)
- Capital Campaign: We have raised \$4.4M towards a goal of \$5M
 - Campaign purpose of upgrading various buildings on the campus to serve our ministries and plan for the future growth of the church
- Boards and Committees – many other ways to get involved, including
 - Council – overall spiritual health and ministries of the church
 - Trustees – financial health of the church and campus
 - Diaconate – supports worship
 - Mission and Outreach: Board of Outreach and Mission (BOOM), This 'N That Thrift Shop and Emergency Response Fund
- This 'N That Thrift Shop on Commodore Plaza in Coconut Grove
- Martha Clinton Plymouth Preschool (ages 2-4); church members priority spaces
